Licensing Requirements

To obtain licensing as a Practical Nurse, applicants must be graduates of a state-approved educational program and pass a computer-based exam. All states require a license in order to function as a practical nurse.

Accreditation

The Clarion County Career Center Practical Nursing Program is fully accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN) and provisionally approved by the PA State Board of Nursing.

Length of Course

A one-year program is offered in September every year.

A two-year part-time program is offered in November every other year.
